Mom, why can't Raea read?



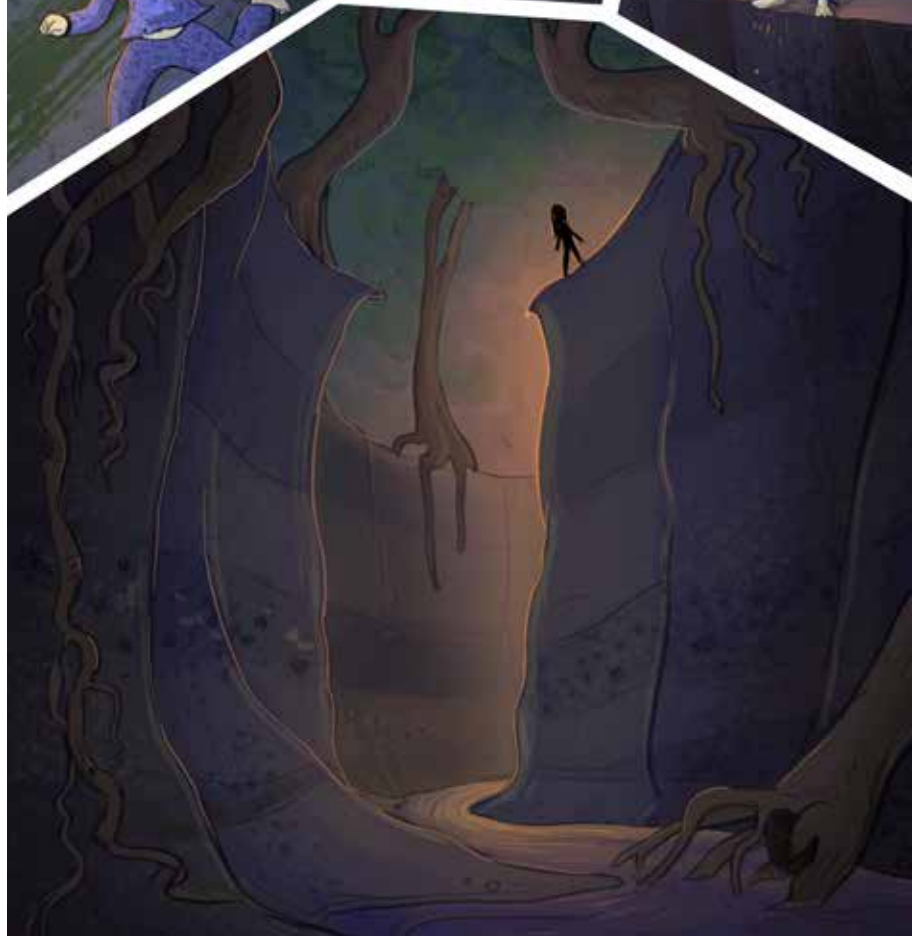

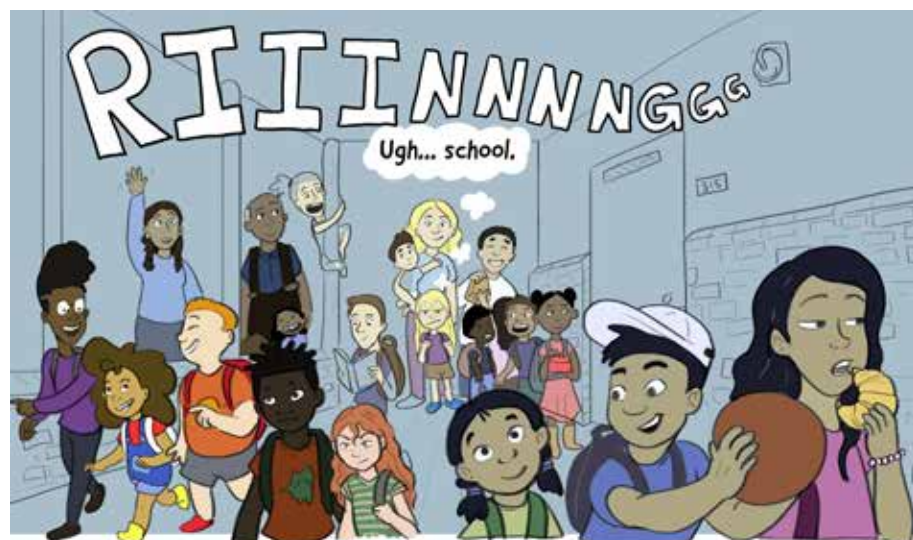

with all your heart.

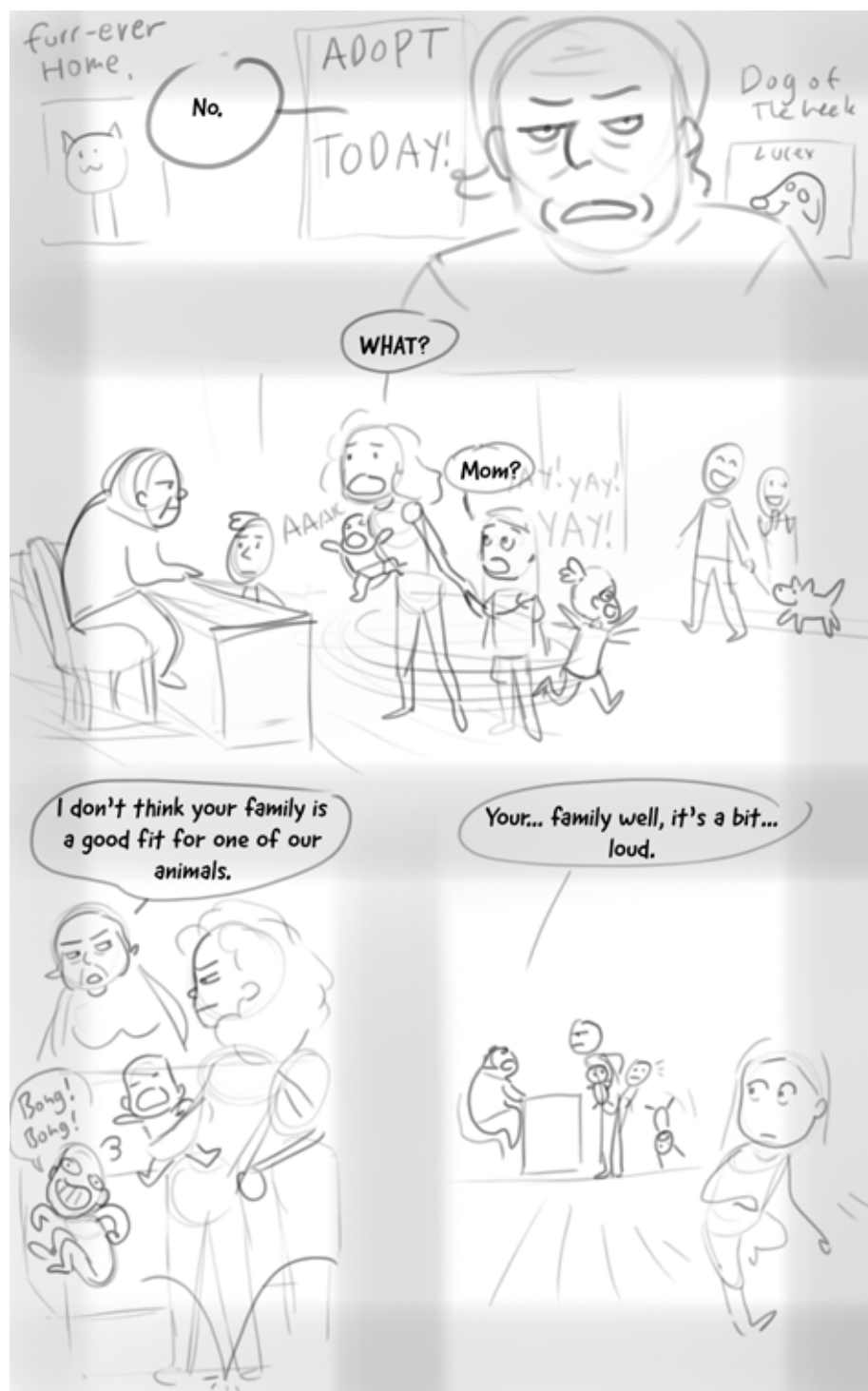

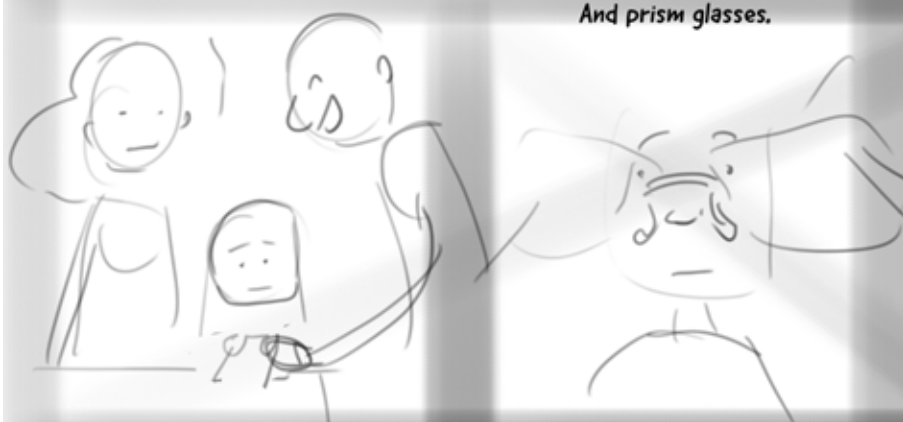


She has convergence insufficiency, or in more simple terms: double vision. One of the worst cases I've ever seen. I can't believe no one caught this.



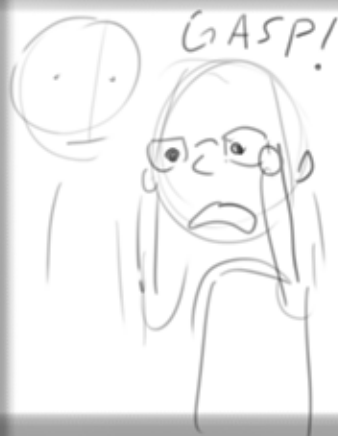
With a year of vision therapy.

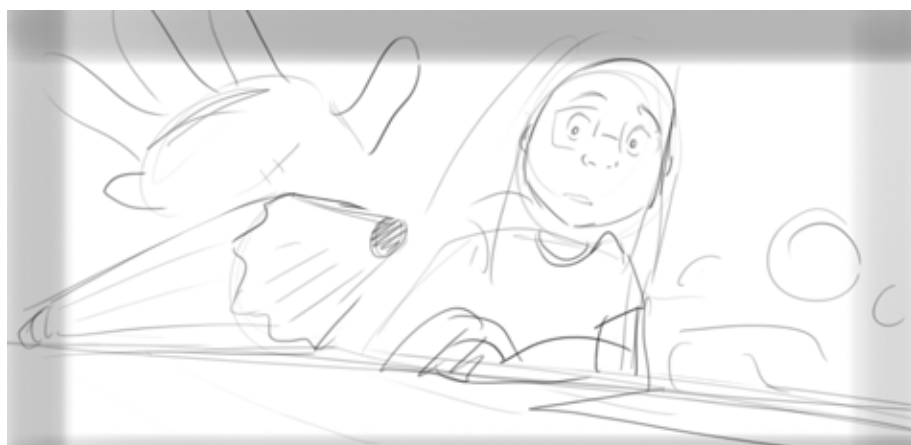

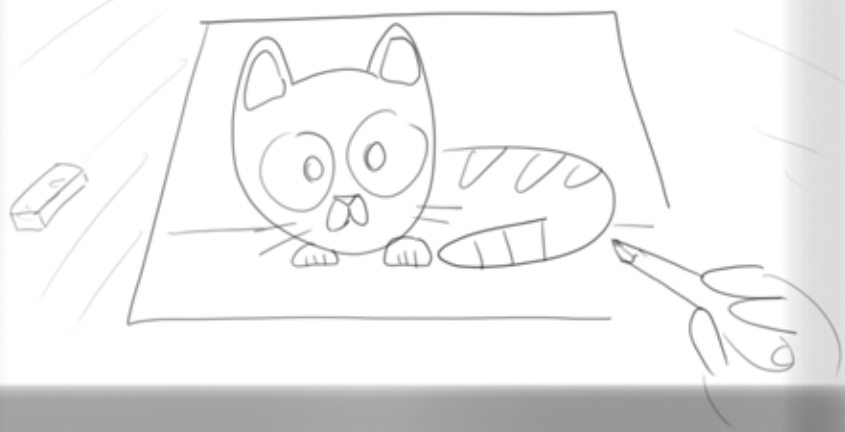
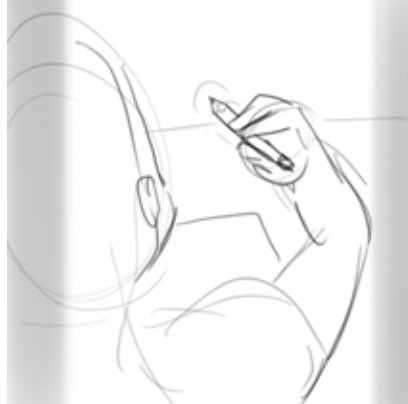

### Not Autistic or Hyperactive. Just Seeing Double at Times

As an infant, Raen Gragg was withdrawn and could not make eye contact. By preschool she needed to smell and squeeze every object she saw.

"She touched faces and would bring everything to mouth," said her mother, Kara Gragg. "She would go up to people, sniff them and touch their cheeks."

Specialists conducted a battery of tests. The possible diagnoses mounted: autism spectrum disorder, neurofibromatosis, attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder, anxiety disorder.

A behavioral pediatrician prescribed three drugs for attention deficit and depression. The only constraint was that Raen, now 9, did anything she could to avoid reading and writing.





"Raea didn't know how to describe it because that's all she's got to know," her mother said. "She felt like she had been telling us all along that she couldn't see, but nobody listened."



I have a special story for you today. I'm here with nine-year-old Raea Gragg.



After years of misdiagnosis.

Raea is finally being treated with a seeing disorder called convergence insufficiency.



Aproximailty 13% of all school age students have C.I. but it usually goes unnoticed.



But now, thanks to her vision therapy and glasses.



Raea will be able to see and learn how to read.









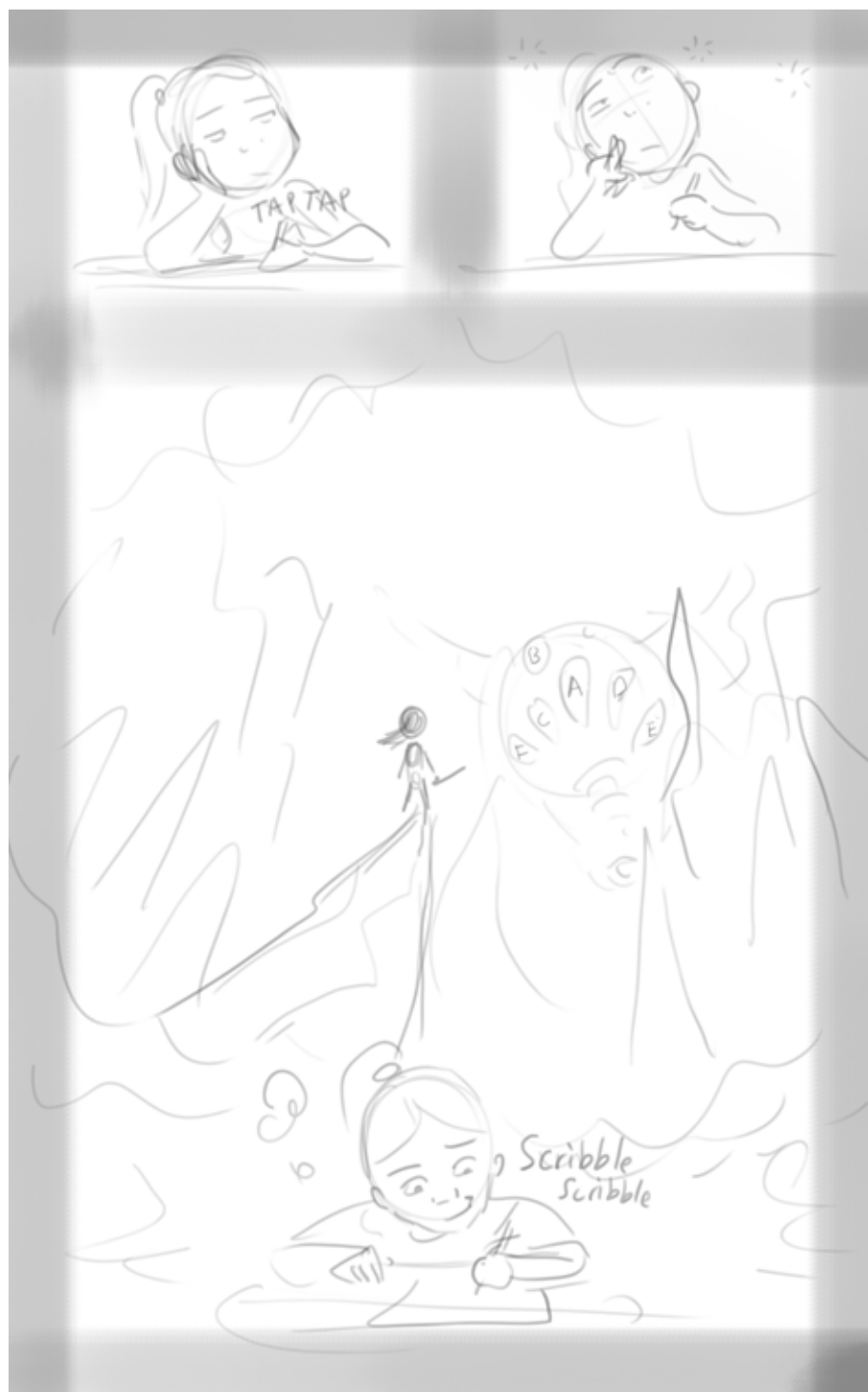

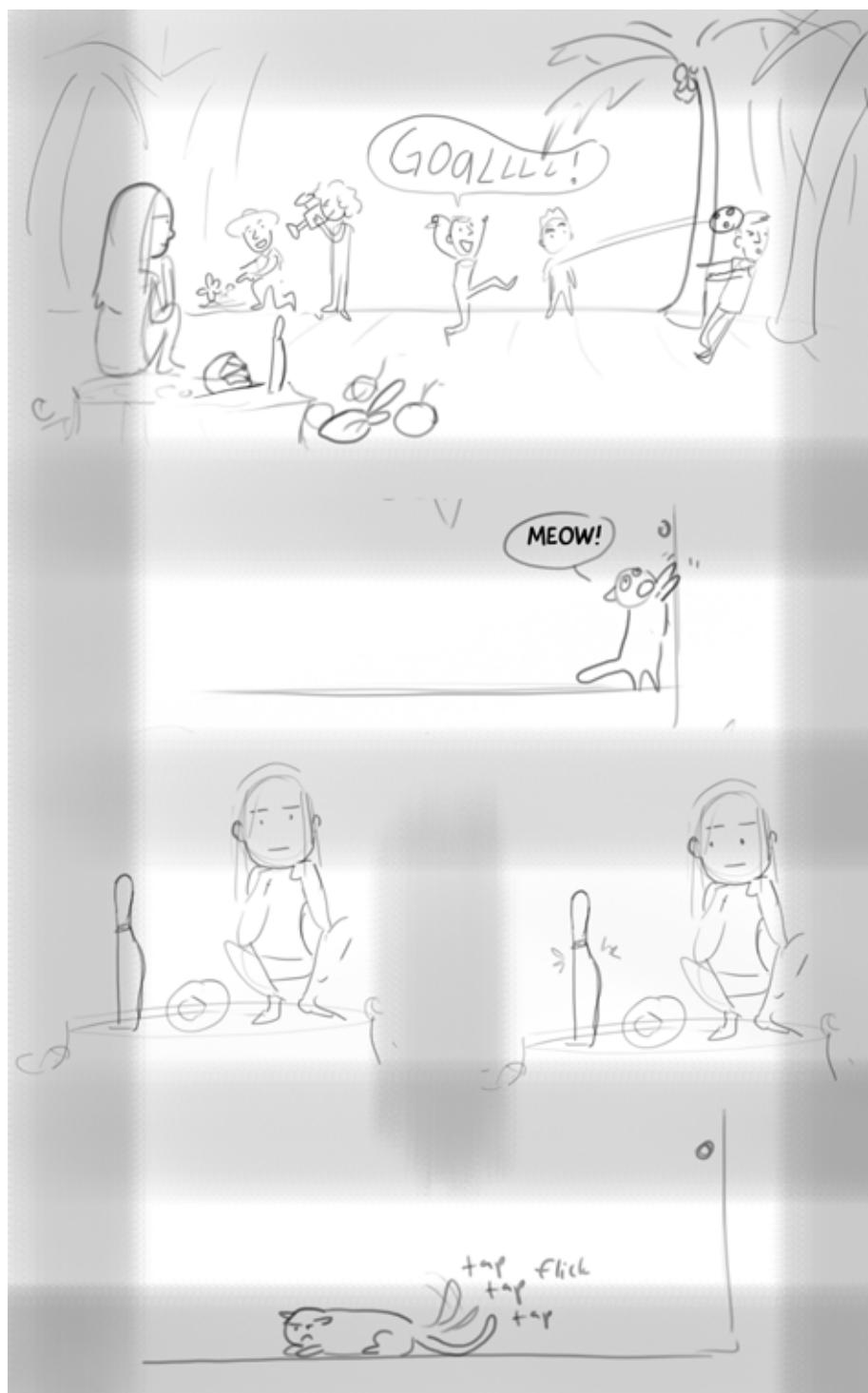

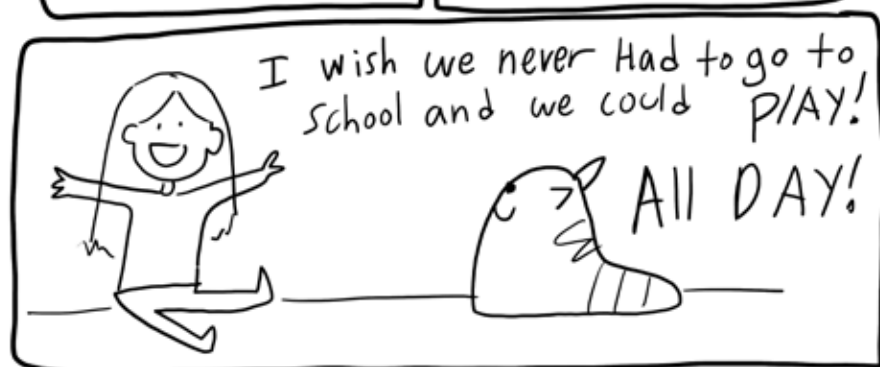


































I feel like you need at least a 3.7 GPA to get into any of the state schools.

and I written it. Um? I would tear a word.

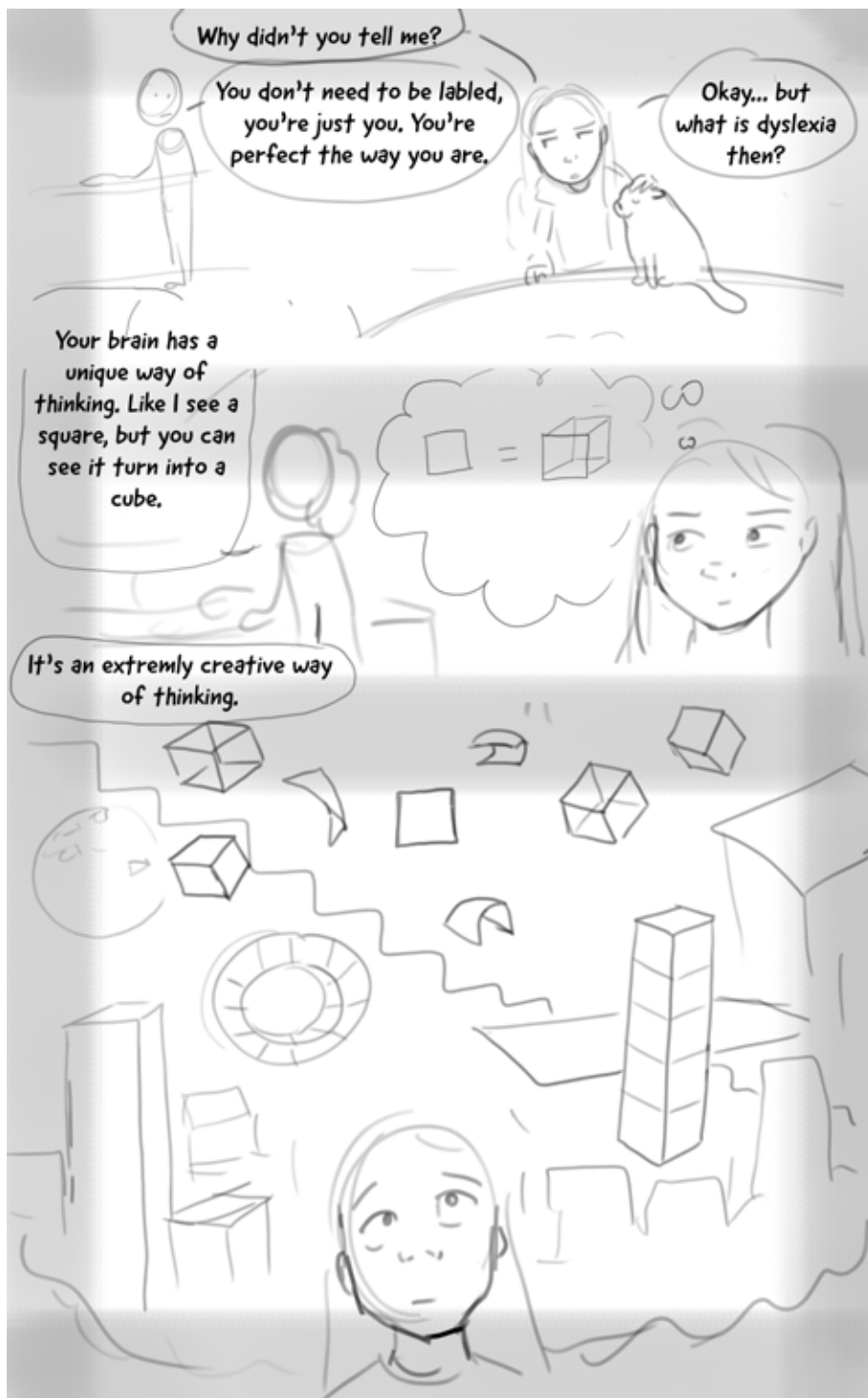

Like my vision problems?











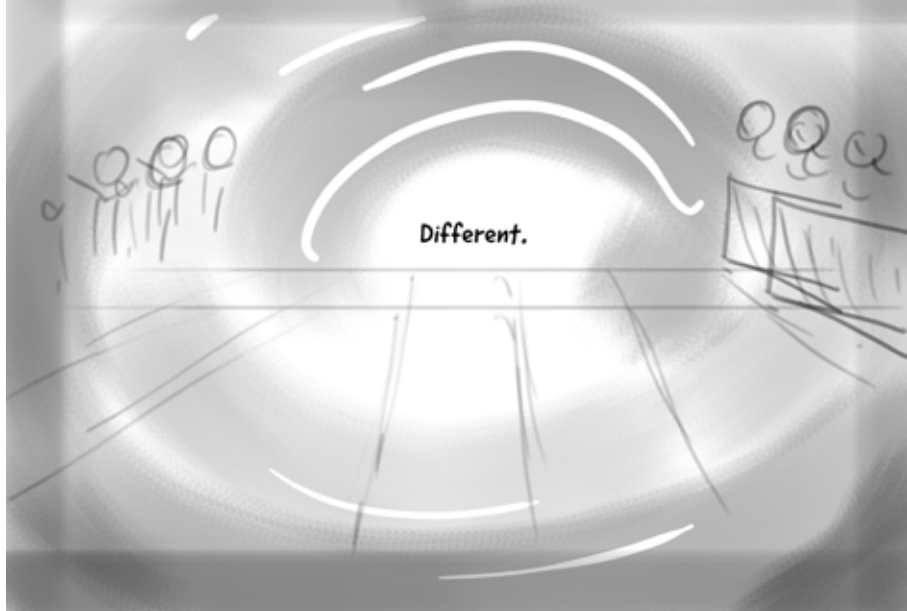

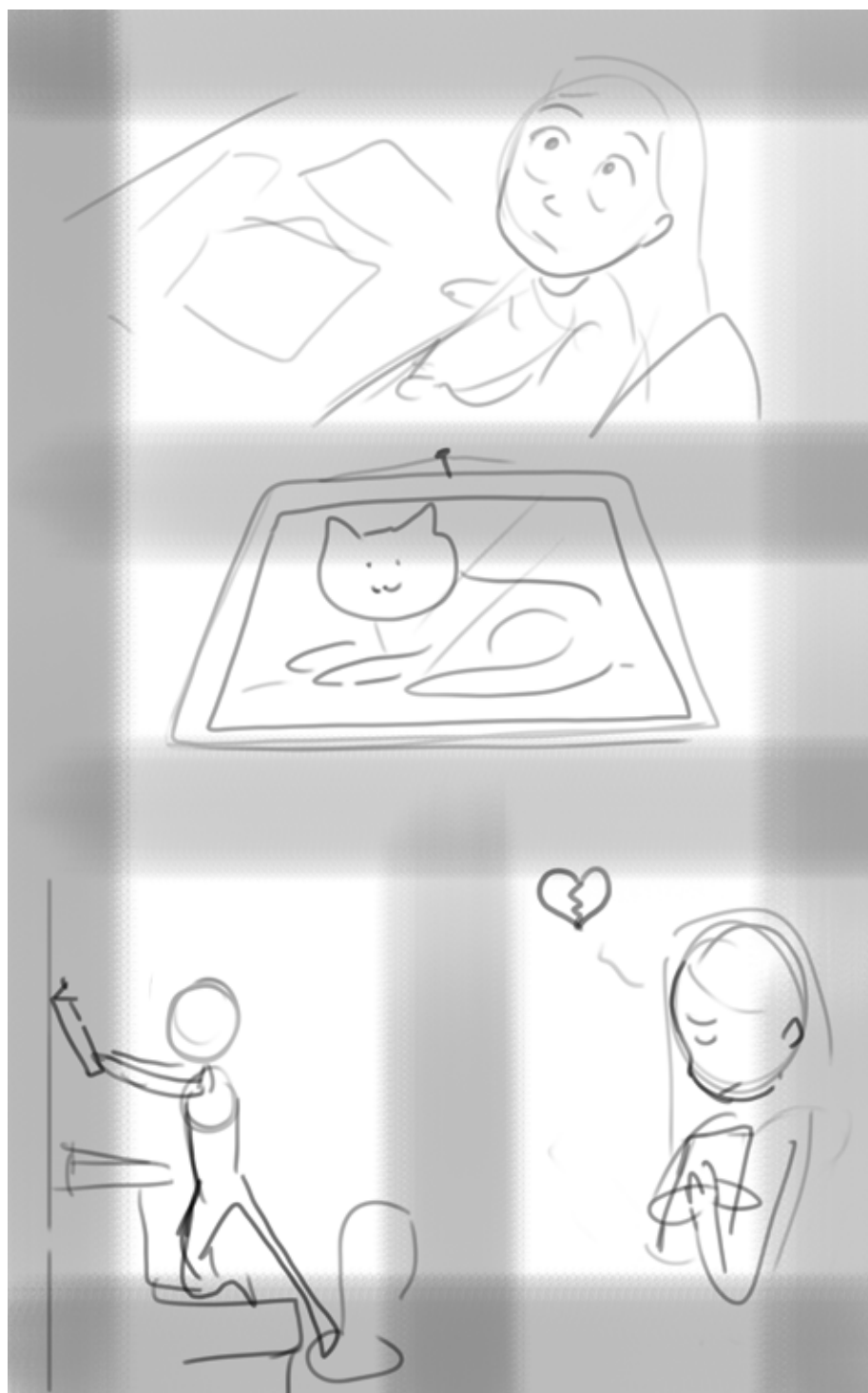






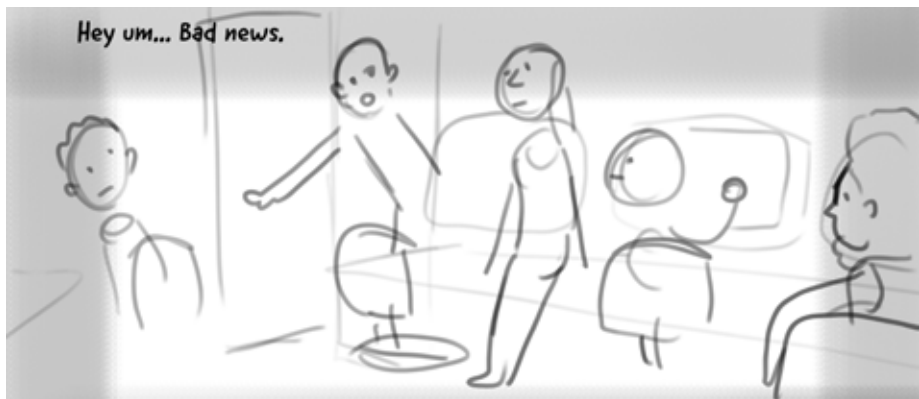








Hey um... Bad news.

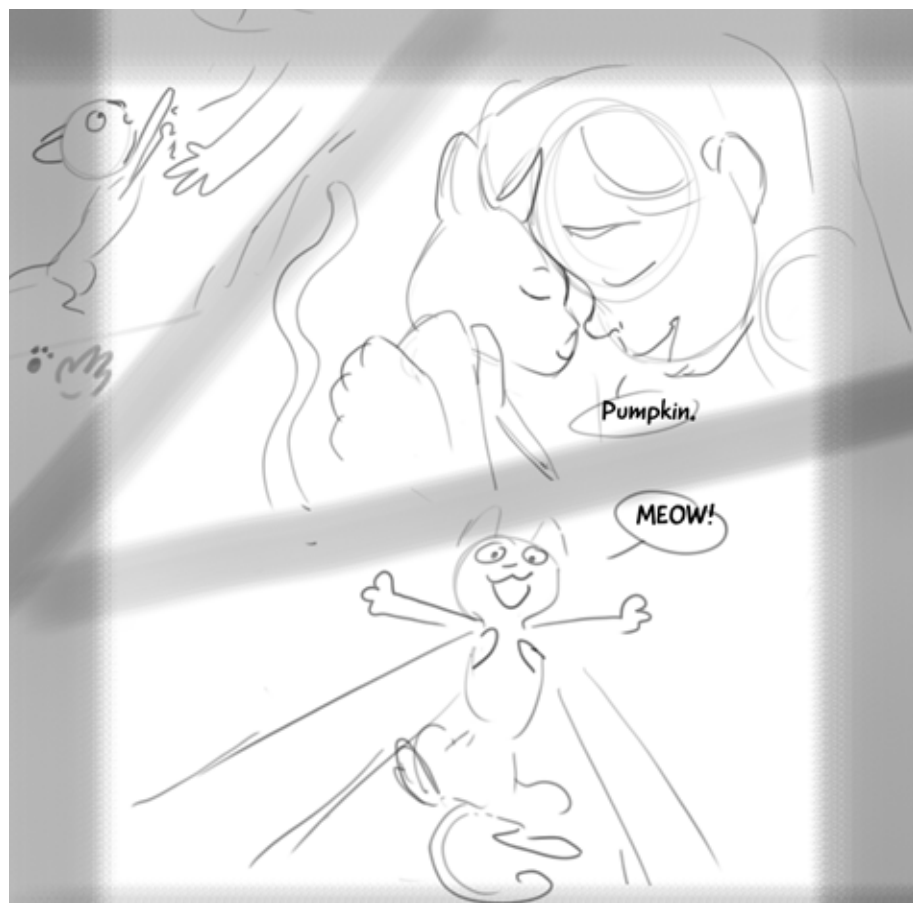


They're cancelling school

of books.

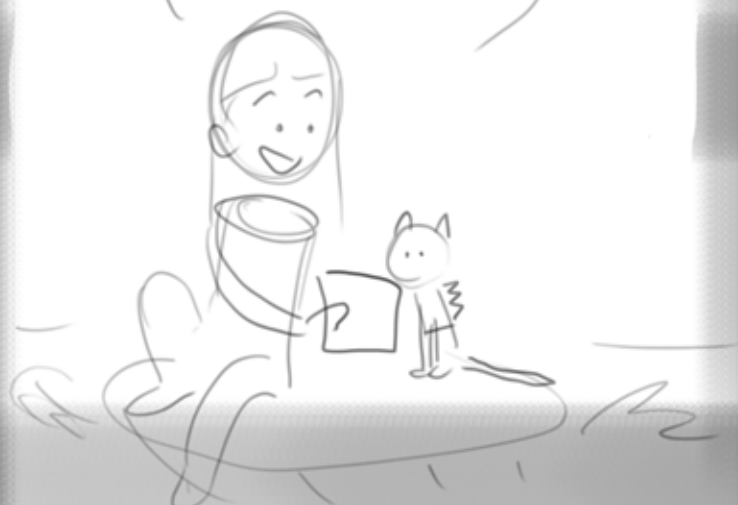
